MASK TEMPLE

- Construction began around 200BC and continued up until 1450AD.
- Mask dates to around 500AD.
- Headdress of Mask is a crocodile signifying it's importance to the site.
- Royal tombs found here; date to around 500AD.

HIGH TEMPLE

- Initially constructed in 100BC
- Final modifications made in 600AD
- Used for residential then ceremonial purposes
- Cache containing 1,024 obsidian cores and 7,503 blades.

BALL COURT

- Late 800's to 900's AD
- May have been 2 ball courts
- Beneath the marker was an offering containing lidded miniature pots and a pool of liquid mercury.

STELLA TEMPLE

- Used into the 1100's and beyond.
- Stela 9 depicts Lord Smoking Shell; erected 600-700AD
- Cache found contained shell beads, chips of chert and obsidian, one large chert blade and skeletons of 5 or more children, ages 2-8 yrs probably sacrificed

RESIDENTIAL AREA

- Site of elite residential area from 900's through 1200's - AD
- Many caches and burials found here.
- Artifacts included metal and copper tweezers

JAGUAR TEMPLE & PLAZA

- Initially constructed during 1500's
- Used into the 1400's and beyond
- Focus on ceremonial activity

SPANISH CHURCHES

- Church 1 built in the 1540's
- Second church built in the late 1560's and was burnt down by The Maya
